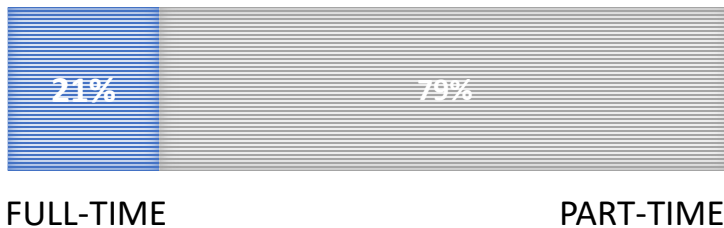

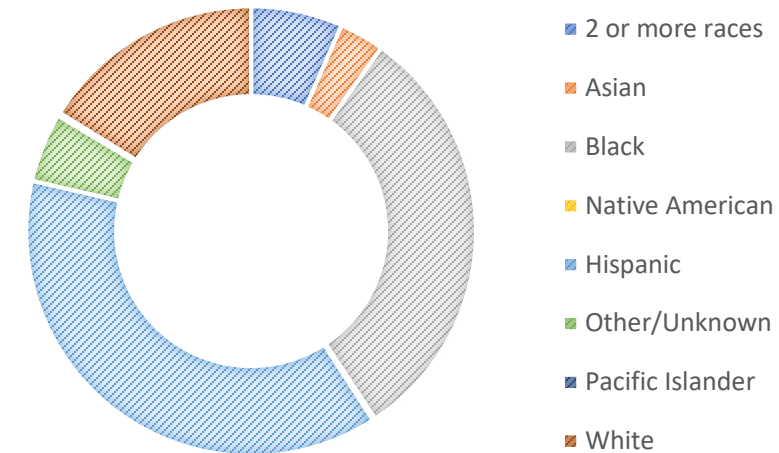

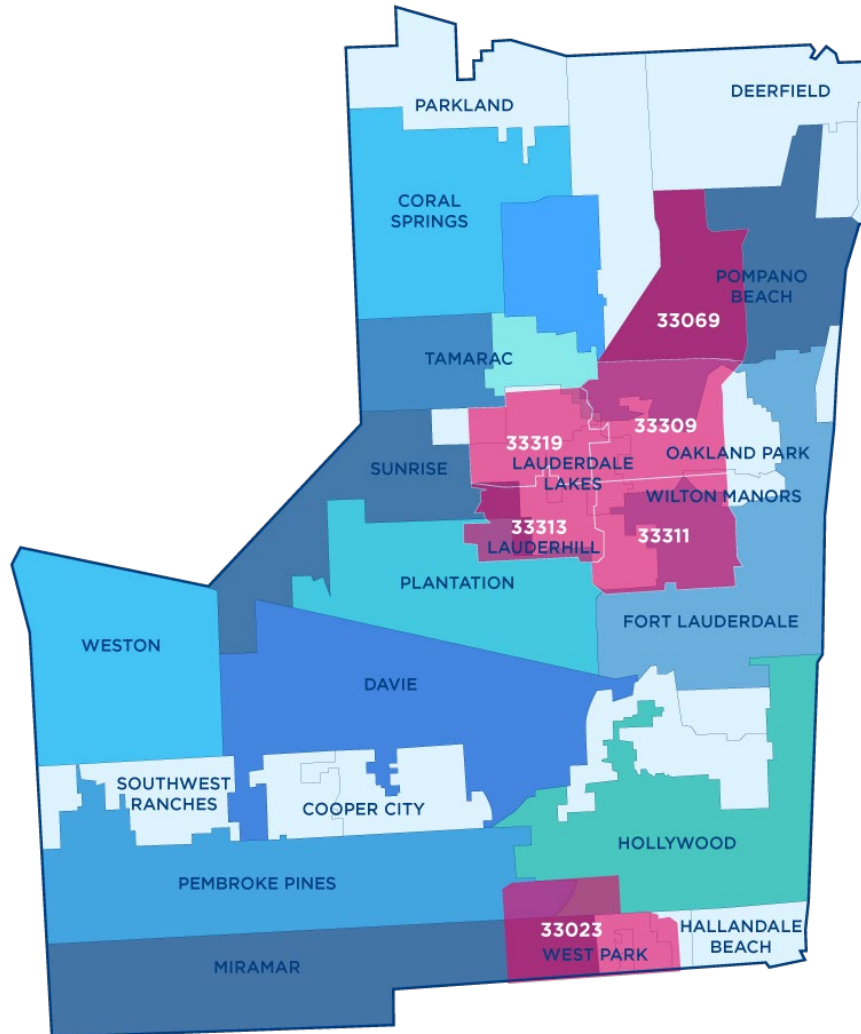


RACE/ETHNICITY

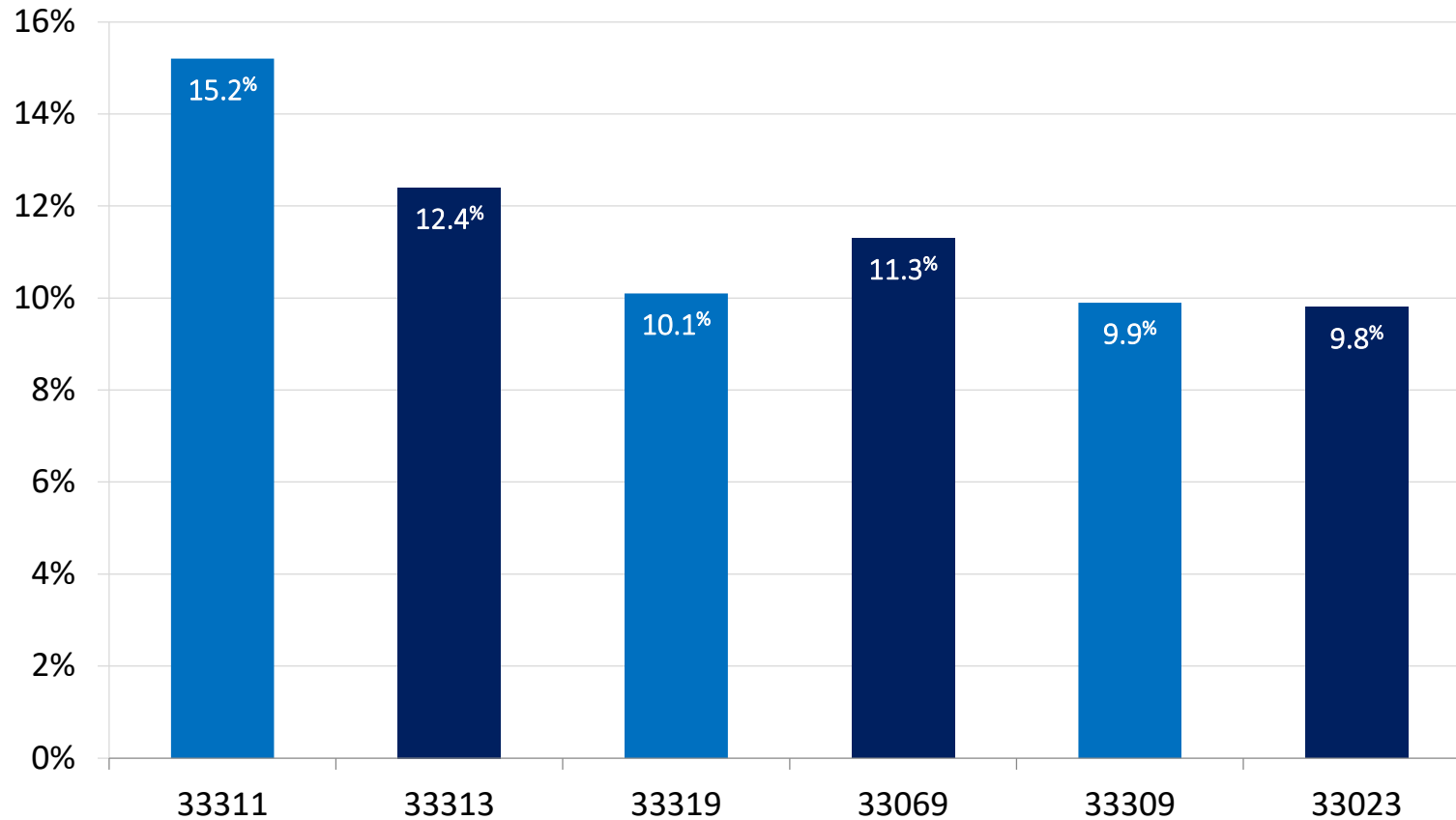

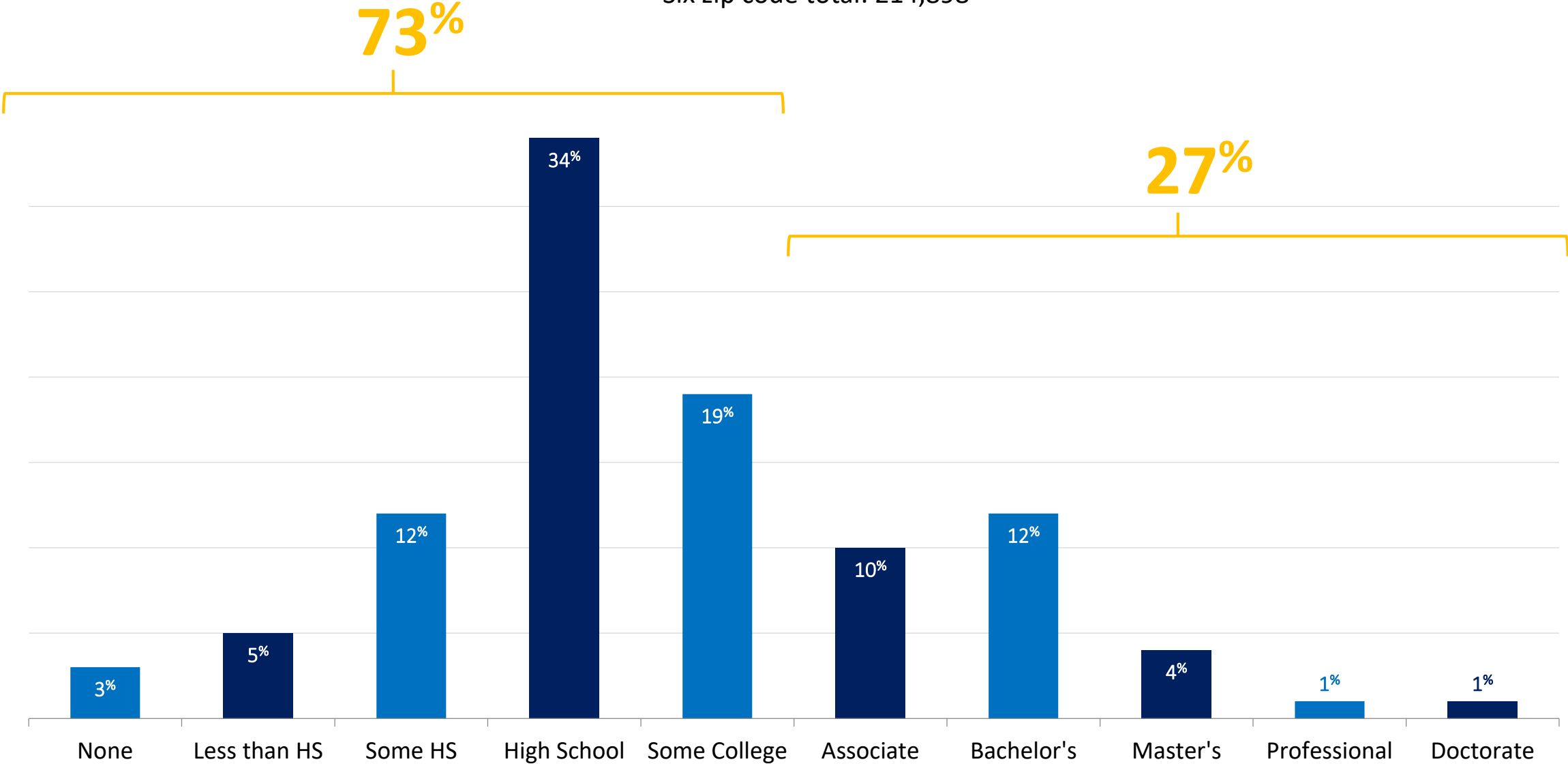

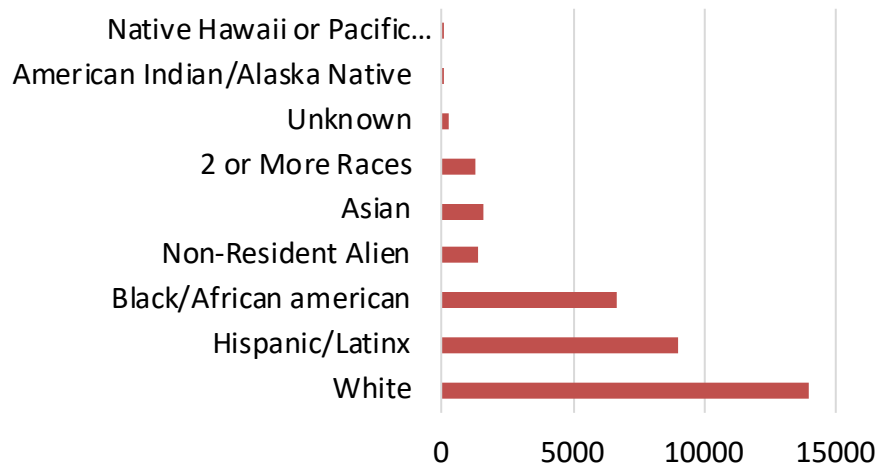
