WHO ARE WE AND A BRIEF HISTORY



DEL MAR COLLEGE

- Del Mar College (DMC) is a two-year institution founded in 1935 and located in Corpus Christi, Texas.
- Del Mar College serves seven counties in a 7,541 square mile geographic area. This area is the size of Connecticut and Rhode Island combined with an economically challenged population of over 500,000, of which 375,000 are Hispanic.
- 89% of enrolled students come from the Corpus Christi. 43.1% are men and 56.9% are women.
- Fall 2017 enrollment consisted of 11,506 students with 7,698 or 66.9% identifying themselves as Hispanic.
- DMC is ranked among the nation's top three percent of community colleges



- Increase Graduation rate (currently 11%)
- Minimize Stop-outs and Core-complete Transfers
- Minimize time to completion for Associates Degree
- Lack of exposure to Financial Literacy
- Student retention drops after completing 24 hours.

GRADUATION COACHING PROCESS

Phase 1 - Identification and Scheduling

- → Pre-Assessment during scheduling
- → Degree Programs
- → Special Circumstances

Phase 2 - Student Visits and Referrals

- → Initial Session
 - ♦ Referral to Services
 - Schedule Follow Up Appt.
- → Follow up
 - Degree Progress
 - Registration for Next Semester
 - Graduation Application
- → Referral to Services
- → Collect Student Data for Reports

Phase 3 - Graduation & Beyond!

- → Monitor progress to graduation
- → Assist with Final Steps to Certificate or Degree Completion







OUTCOMES

OUTCOMES

- Students with no services provided
 - Decreased by 50% after Civitas introduced
- Increased percentage of assisted students
 - From 22% to 47%
- Graduation Rate
 - 32% of students meeting with a coach



OUTCOMES

- Increased graduation applications
 - Increased graduation applications by 26%. Del Mar was expecting 5% at best
- Increased earlier graduation
 - Students were now graduating with Liberal Arts degrees
- Financial Literacy
 - Loan delinquency rates have decreased by 4%. (18% to 14%)
 - Increased awareness for additional student aid
