Session Format Descriptions

Institutes: Topic specific institutes are open to conference attendees, but will be limited in seating capacity.

The **HSI Grantsmanship Institute** is for participants explore grants-seeking strategies that will optimize your effectiveness as a HSI proposal writer. Part I will take place on Sunday April 9th and Part II on Wednesday, April 12th). The **Project Management & Evidence-based Practices Institute** is professional development opportunity for Title V Project Directors and project staff. The **Equity Institute** will focus on a recent volume of New Directions in Higher Education edited by Freeman & Martinez (2015) about Latino/a Student Success. The **HSI Student Institute** is for students attending the conference, and will focus on building a sense of community for student leaders at HSIs. Full descriptions of Institutes begin on Page 3.

Duration: 6 hours (with one-hour working lunch, breakout sessions and scheduled breaks)

High Impact Practice Presentations: These sessions will feature evidence-based, high impact practices proven to be effective at HSIs. These presentations are delivered through PowerPoint or panel sessions and allow for a 15-20 minute question and answer period.

Duration: 60 minutes

Community of Practice Workshops: These hands-on sessions will be facilitated by HSI professionals and will include evidence-based, high impact practices proven to be effective at HSIs. Presentation delivery will be a workshop format with clear outcomes for participants. These workshops will engage participants through interactive activities, teamwork, and hands-on experience. Participants will leave with enough resources and tangible examples for implementation at their respective institutions. Duration: 1 hour and 15 minutes

Special Topic Sessions: These sessions will feature invited speakers and presenters to lead special topic sessions that inform policy and practice at HSIs such as Funding for HSIs Beyond Title V, High Impact Practices at HSIs, Advancing Research & Transformative Practices at HSIs, Undocumented Students and Dreamers at HSIs, Cultivating Student Leaders at HSIs and more. Description/Agenda

The HSI Grantsmanship Institute is an opportunity to explore grants-seeking strategies that will optimize your effectiveness as a HSI proposal writer, and to identify funding opportunities where your HSI/MSI status improves your ability to compete for grants.

Part I of the Institute will focus on several topics, including:

- HSI Status and Strategic Grantsmanship
- The role of Title V in your institution's development as a HSI
- Elements of a successful HSI-specific proposal
- Building an application that will actually work once funded
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Part II of the Institute will examine and discuss HSI programs at various Federal agencies, such as USDA, NSF, HRSA and others. The Institute will provide interactive, hands-on training for participants, with an emphasis on overcoming barriers and improving outcomes for the participants. Part I will include a working lunch (group exercise).

Latino/a Student Success: From Scholarship to Practice

Latino/as are the fastest growing demographic in the United States. They represent 17% of the U.S. population and are projected to represent 31% by 2060. Despite recent gains in postsecondary enrollment, they are still severely underrepresented when it comes to baccalaureate attainment. Hispanic Serving Institutions (HSIs) will play a critical role in increasing the number of Latino/as with college degrees. This Institute will focus on a recent volume of *New Directions in Higher Education* edited by Freeman & Martinez (2015) about Latino/a Student Success. A panel of contributing authors will discuss each of their findings. Following we will break into round tables to discuss specific topics more in depth. Finally, there will be hands on activities that will guide participants to implement research in order to improve practice on their campuses leading to increased Latino/a student success.

Description/Agenda:

The AHSIE Student Leadership Institute is designed to empower students with a strong foundational set of academic, leadership, career, and life skills.
